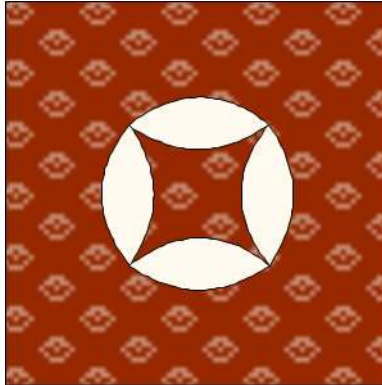


A-03 Hunter's Moon



For this block, I would suggest cutting the four melon shapes (without the seam allowance) out of freezer paper, iron the freezer paper on the wrong side of your fabric, cut out the melon, with a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Finger press the seam allowance to the back of the freezer paper. Using running stitches, (small basting stitches) , stitch the seam allowance in place, on all four melons. Press the shapes, using spray starch. Carefully remove the running stitches and the freezer paper, keeping the seam allowance pressed to the back and keeping the shape of the melon. The spray starch should keep the shape in place. Now, with a tiny tack stitch , tack the ends of the melons together, making the melons form a circle. Place your melon circle in the center of the block. You can find the center by lightly pressing your square in both diagonals. Each tacked melon should touch a diagonal crease in the square. This will form a perfect circle of melons. Applique' your melons to the background fabric using thread to match the melons.
